ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A completed application form (found at apply.mercyhurst.edu)
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions sent directly to Mercyhurst
- · Three letters of recommendation
- A resume or curriculum vitae
- A 300- to 500-word essay outlining your personal, professional and educational goals.
- · Graduate Record Exam (GRE) or GMAT

FEES & FINANCIAL FACTS

While graduate students are not eligible for Pell and PHEAA grants, they are eligible for educational loans and must file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The annual maximum loan amount available is \$20,500. Please be aware you will not qualify for loans if you have reached your lifetime aggregate loan limit of \$138,500.

If you are eligible for tuition assistance from your employer, a deferment program is available and allows you to defer your tuition and fees until the end of the term when your employer reimburses you. No interest will be charged on deferred tuition. Tuition deferment forms must be completed and are available at the Office of Graduate Studies.

Mercyhurst University also offers the option of a payment plan with 10 monthly installments through Tuition Management Systems. There is a \$50 enrollment fee.

GRADUATE EMPLOYMENT

The University offers two programs for graduate students: Graduate Assistantships and Graduate Employment. Positions are limited and are not guaranteed. Each program requires at least 25 hours of work per week at a location on campus. Graduate students must attend Mercyhurst on a full-time basis in order to be eligible for graduate employment.

Master of Science in Organizational Leadership Concentration in Higher Education Administration

WHY STUDY HIGHER EDUCATION ADMINISTRATION?

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics indicates that the number of students at the post-secondary level is expected to grow more rapidly than other student populations. With this increase in students comes an increased need for leaders in the field of higher education. Employment in education administration is expected to grow by about 8 percent between now and 2018.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Master of Science degree in Organizational Leadership (OL) with a concentration in higher education administration is a 36-credit program designed to develop expertise across a wide range of functions in higher education. Students work collaboratively with university administrators, staff and faculty in the application of theoretical concepts in the areas of program development, assessment, policy formulation and problem resolution.

Designed to meet the needs and schedules of working students, the program can be completed in two years. Courses are offered in the evenings to accommodate the working professional.

Mercyhurst also offers a 15-credit graduate certificate in higher education administration.

OL VS. MBA?

While the MBA emphasizes management and administrative functions within an organization (the primary focus being on order and consistency), Mercyhurst's Organizational Leadership Master of Science degree emphasizes professional leadership, while concentrating on vision and empowerment.

PROGRAM PHILOSOPHY

The OL program challenges students to synthesize contemporary scholarship with insight from our service-oriented, ethically based heritage. The purpose of the organizational leadership graduate program is to inspire our students to become exemplary leaders in service to others.
