Biographies

Sarah Hamilton

Dr. Sarah Hamilton is professor of oboe at the State University of New York at Fredonia, where



she is also the associate director. She is also principal oboe with the Western New York Chamber Orchestra and English hornist with the Erie Philharmonic. She has performed regularly with Bach and Beyond, the Buffalo Philharmonic and the Chautauqua Symphony. Hamilton has appeared as a soloist most recently with the Orchard Park Symphony (on bass oboe), The Silver Band, the Erie Philharmonic, the Western New York Chamber Orchestra, the Fredonia College Orchestra and Wind Ensemble, and at conventions of the International Double Reed Society. She began her professional career as second oboe and English horn with the Windsor (Ontario) Symphony.

Recently, as a member of the touring Can-Am Oboe Trio,

Hamilton received a Canada Council Grant for the creation of three new oboe trio works by Canadian composers, all of which have been recorded and are soon to be released.

Hamilton has given many presentations on making the oboe more accessible in public school programs at New York state, Erie County, Chautauqua County, and Ontario, Canada music teacher association conferences.

She has composed for the young oboist: Oboe Tuning Duets and Big Book of Sightreading Duets for Oboe have recently been published by Mountainpeak Music, and she is co-author of the oboe chapter of *Teaching Woodwinds*, an online woodwind method book published by Mountainpeak Music in 2014. More of her information and resources for helping the younger oboe player are available at OboeHelp.com.

While on sabbatical several years ago, she was able to devote time to exploring her fascination in the diversity of the oboe community and the new classical music paradigm. From this research, she created the presentation Finding your Way as a 21st Century Performing Musician.

Hamilton holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from The Ohio State University and a Master of Music degree from Wayne State University, where she studied with former Detroit Symphony oboist Robert Sorton. She holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Western Ontario where her teachers included Shelley Heron, Geralyn Giovannetti and Perry Baumen. She began her studies with Lawrence Cherney in Toronto, Canada.

Andrew Seigel



Dr. Andrew Seigel is professor of clarinet and chair of the Music Performance Department at the State University of New York at Fredonia, where he teaches clarinet, coaches chamber music, and conducts the clarinet ensemble. He joined the faculty of Fredonia in 2008 following positions at Southeastern Louisiana University and Michigan State University.

Seigel's scholarly and musical pursuits have taken him throughout the country and around the world. He and his wife, flutist Nicole McPherson, traveled to Abu Dhabi in 2016 to perform and record works by composer Matthew Quayle. Two years as a Fulbright Scholar in Budapest allowed him to study at Hungary's Franz Liszt Academy of Music and to perform throughout Romania and Germany.

Living in western New York, Seigel currently performs with the Western New York Chamber Orchestra, the Buffalo Chamber Players, the Fredonia Woodwind Quintet, the Silverwind Duo, and occasionally with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra and Chautauqua Symphony Orchestra. He has previously held orchestral positions in Pennsylvania, Michigan, Louisiana and Mississippi and has performed or presented in 25 of the 50 states. His recordings "American Kaleidoscope" and "Aurora" on the Emeritus label feature a wide range of chamber music for clarinet and flute and clarinet and organ.

Seigel completed his doctorate at Michigan State University as a Distinguished Fellow, a student of Elsa Ludewig-Verdehr. Originally from California, Seigel received degrees from California State University – Fresno. Among his own students, he counts a million-dollar-winning video gamer, a nationally-renowned neurosurgeon, a librarian who helped to bring "Happy Birthday" into the public domain, military band musicians, and scores of elementary, middle, and high school band teachers throughout the country, from Alaska to Florida.



Hae-yeun Jeun

Dr. Hae-yeun Jeun, a native of South Korea, is an active pianist and chamber musician based in upstate New York. Jeun is a member of the award-winning, artist-led ensemble fivebyfive and a prize winning musician with a long list of achievements, including top prizes at the Seattle International Piano Competition, Osaka International Competition, and many more. She has taught at the Finger Lakes Community College and currently serves as a collaborative pianist at the SUNY Fredonia School of Music. She earned her bachelor's degree from Seoul National University and graduate degrees (MM/DMA) from the Eastman School of Music under the guidance of Dr. Douglas Humpherys. She lives in Buffalo with her guitarist husband and two children.
