

### **Biographies**

### **Kent Brass Ouintet**

The Kent Brass Quintet (KBQ) is a faculty ensemble-in-residence in the Hugh A. Glauser School of Music at Kent State. The KBQ plays both original music and transcriptions from a wide variety of styles and periods ranging from the Renaissance to jazz and new compositions. In addition to concerts and recitals, the quintet enjoys giving performance/clinics for high school music programs throughout the region.



### Amanda Bekeny, trumpet Amanda Bekeny

Amanda Bekeny discovered her passion for orchestral and chamber music as a young trumpet student

of her longtime mentor and friend, composer Dr. Jack Gallagher. She now enjoys sharing her enthusiasm for performing with her college students at Cleveland State University and Kent State University. An active performer, Dr. Bekeny is a member of CityMusic Cleveland Chamber Orchestra, Firelands Symphony Orchestra, Diamond Brass Quintet, and co-founded the Olympic Brass Quintet. Dr. Bekeny can regularly be heard performing with other arts organizations, including the Akron Symphony, Cleveland Pops Orchestra, and the Athena Brass Band. In the community, Dr. Bekeny serves as Music Director of the Rocky River Chamber Music Society.



### Jack Brndiar, trumpet

Jack Brndiar, trumpet, is a freelance musician, performing with many ensembles and has taught at a number of colleges and universities in Ohio, including the University of Akron, Oberlin College, and Kent State University. He

is a graduate of Baldwin-Wallace College and the Cleveland Institute of Music.

## Ben Hottensmith, horn

A native of northeast Ohio, Benjamin Hottensmith currently serves as Adjunct Instructor of Horn at Kent State University. An avid performer, Ben



is a member of the Ashland Symphony and Kent Brass Quintet, and has performed with groups throughout the region including the Columbus Symphony, Lexington Philharmonic, CityMusic Cleveland Chamber Orchestra, and Ohio Light Opera. Ben completed his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in May of 2020 at The Ohio State University under the tutelage of Professor Bruce Henniss. Prior to Ohio State, Ben attended Kent State University and The University of Akron studying with Kent Larmee and Margaret Tung, respectively.

### David Mitchell, trombone

David Mitchell has been a part of the Kent State faculty since 2001. A member of the Kent Brass Quintet, he is also an original member of the acclaimed



Burning River Brass, having toured internationally and heard on NPR's Performance Today. He also performs with Blue Water Chamber Orchestra and has previously held posts with the Cleveland Opera and Ballet Orchestras. In addition to playing in the pit orchestra at Playhouse Square for numerous national touring Broadway shows such as Disney's The Lion King, he toured nationally for a year with the National Touring Company of "The Music of Andrew Lloyd Webber. In other performances he has played with diverse musicians as Luciano Pavorotti, Johnny Mathis, Barry Manilow and The Who.

### Ken Heinlein, tuba

Dr. Ken Heinlein is Principal Tuba with both the Akron Symphony and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestras and has appeared on multiple occasions as a featured soloist with both ensembles. Additionally, he performs each summer as Principal Tuba with the Blossom Festival Band and conducts the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra Brass Choir. Dr. Heinlein has also performed with the Cleveland Orchestra, the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, the Grand Rapids Symphony, and the Jacksonville Symphony Orchestra; he also performs frequently with the Cleveland Orchestra Brass Quintet.

Dr. Heinlein serves as Assistant Professor of Tuba and Euphonium and Director of Brass Ensembles at Baldwin Wallace Conservatory of Music. He also teaches at Kent State University and previously has taught at Case Western Reserve University and the University of Michigan.



### Larry Herman, trumpet

Trumpeter Larry Herman holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree and a Master of Music Performance degree from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music where he was nominated for both a Performer's Certificate and Brass Fellowship. He has served on the faculty at Indiana University, the Interlochen Arts Academy, Western Carolina University, the National Music Camp at Interlochen, and the Oberlin Conservatory of Music. Mr. Herman currently performs regularly with the Canton Symphony, the Erie Philharmonic, the Sarasota Opera Orchestra, and the Cleveland Pops Orchestra. He has also performed with the Cleveland Orchestra, CityMusic Cleveland, the Bluewater Chamber Orchestra, and the Blossom Festival Band.
